Started as a four-day conference in California 30 years ago, TED has grown to support its mission with multiple initiatives. The two annual TED Conferences invite the world's leading thinkers and doers to speak for 18 minutes or less. Many of these talks are then made available, free, at TED.com. TED speakers have included Bill Gates, Jane Goodall, Elizabeth Gilbert, Sir Richard Branson, Nandan Nilekani, Philippe Starck, Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, Sal Khan and Daniel Kahneman.

About TEDx- x = independently organized event In the spirit of ideas worth spreading, TEDx is a program of local, self-organized events that bring people together to share a TED-like experience. At a TEDx event, TEDTalks video and live speakers combine to spark deep discussion and connection. These local, self-organized events are branded TEDx, where x = independently organized TED event. The TED Conference provides general guidance for the TEDx program, but individual TEDx events are self-organized.

About TEDxJECRC- TEDx JECRC was one of its kind event organized in JECRC by a team of engineering students that aimed to “DISCOVER SOCIETY” at its best. The event hosted speakers from peculiar verses of society that ranged from comedy to fashion to global issues. The aim was to bring the IDEAS WORTH SPREADING to the 100 intellectual students of JECRC who would take inspirations from those ideas and change the world for good. TEDx

JECRC is not just about speakers, but is also about the right audience who would be able to listen to and engage with content, so as the ideas will propagate with their conversations.

The theme ‘Discovering Society’- Human is a social animal, humans live in a society. But the question that is left unanswered is, how much do we know about our own society. We are sceptical about our own neighbourhood, be it Nation’s neighbourhood, or the neighbours who reside near our homes, but even then we claim to be social.

The society at par has too much to offer, but we are still stuck with the conventional paths. The truth is, there is a lot yet to be discovered about our society, and TEDx JECRC tried its best to leave no stones unturned.

The Sequence of Preparation for TEDxJECRC

Licence- TEDx licence can be availed for one year by filling the licence form at TED.com by first registering on the same. Mr Shubham Gupta, a student of IV year, Mechanical Engineering, applied for the licence of TEDx University event, in August 2016. (Being an enthusiastic follower of TED, he had also applied to volunteer for TEDxJAIPUR an year ago and was in touch with Indian Ambassador to TED, Mr Ajit Singh.) The application form was accepted and followed by an online personal interview which he successfully cleared, thereby availing a one year licence on 15th September 2016, to conduct TEDx event. In his application form he had chosen the theme for the event as “Discovering Society” and the interview was majorly based on the theme of the event and his organisational skills.

Presentation and permission- With the TEDx licence in hand Mr Gupta presented his idea to Mr Anshul Mittal, Student Development Office JECRC Foundation. Mr Mittal supported the idea of conducting TEDx event in the college, soon the idea was approved by the college management.

TEDx Team- In November 2016 began the search for the team members, who had their first meeting around mid of November, things were planned but not much action could be taken in immediate future due to the semester examinations in December’16.

Social Media Launched- On December 21 the Teaser for TEDx JECRC was launched on YouTube channel of TEDxJECRC and the official Facebook Page (<https://www.facebook.com/tedxjecrc/>) was created. On January 3 the logo of TEDxJECRC (as per the written instructions of TED) was posted on the Facebook Page.

Speaker Nomination Form- On 4th Jan the Speaker Nomination Form was released so that the speakers, who see in themselves the potential of presenting a TEDxTalk, can apply. The application forms were later scrutinised on 25th Feb and all applicants were replied to.

RCR Office- In the second week of January 2017 the college management allotted an official email ID (tedxjecrc@jecrc.ac.in), along with a desk and a PC for the TEDx team in the Renaissance Control Room where the team would be working under the guidance of Mr Anshul Mittal for the next three months. On 17 January 2017 the curation and communication team started to enlist the possible speakers and frame the documents on the official desk

provided. By the end of January documents like Speaker Guidelines, Content Guidelines and the Invitations were prepared and ready to be sent.

Registrations- As per the licence agreement only 100 students of the institute, were allowed to attend the event. The Registrations were accepted via Paytm and on the help desk in JECRC foundation and JECRC University with the fee being 800 INR per person. The registrations started on 17th March and closed on 24th March by 1:00PM. Each registered student was given a utility kit and an admit slip.

Promotional Campaign- The proximity of the event pushed the team to start in house promotions. The handmade decorative (which included five 5 feet 'x' structures representing each branch of engineering and one 8 feet long 'x' for the college entrance) were being created by the Operations team. On 16th march the Cheat Code of TEDxJECRC was launched on the Facebook page, it was a contest in which student could record a 2 minute video of themselves describing one burning idea to change the world and send it to the TEDxJECRC email ID. The winner of Cheat Code was promised the refund of registration amount. Registrations and awareness workshops started on the 17th march along with the first contest video being uploaded online. On 24th March Mr Harish Bharadwaj (Ist Yr., ECE) was announces as the winner for his video on 'Stop Food Wastage'. On 21st March the First speaker was released on the FB page. On March 24 the flexes, posters and the creatives were installed systematically in the JECRC Foundation College and JECRC University such that the aura and excitement for TED could be physically felt.

Finalising the Speakers and speaker mentoring- From 12th Jan 2017 the team started reaching out for possible TEDx Speakers. It is the most important responsibility of a TEDx team to look for ideas that are worth spreading and have a potential to change the world for betterment of all. TEDxJECRC team communicated with Mrs Sudha Murthy, Ms Romilla Thapar, Mr Brindeshwar Pathak, Mr Shashi Tharoor, and many more wonderful people. By 22nd Feb the curation had been closed and the communication team was now mentoring the confirmed speakers about the type of content delivered at TEDx, choosing a proper title, visual presentations and informing them about TEDx norms. Mr Raghvendra Singh Rathore, Mr Shashank Subramaniyam and Mr Raghu Raman were some of the names who were cancelled at last moment due to their highly demanding schedules. On 2nd of March the team of TEDxJECRC was delighted to receive last moment confirmations from Mr Bamezai and Ms Nayak.

TEDxJECRC Website- The website of TEDxJECRC was launched on 8th March 2017. All the speakers were asked to share their photographs and confirm their personal information in the speaker profiles.

Hospitality- The confirmation of speakers led to booking of flight, hotel and preparation of itinerary. Each invited speaker was being communicated promptly through phone calls, mails and WhatsApp and the hospitality team was prepared to pick up each speaker punctually. Some of the speakers also visited JECRC University along with student volunteers. A volunteer even sat close to the invited speaker Ms Venkatesan (who had suffered a hearing loss) to explain each ongoing talk by typing it on the laptop so that she could read and understand them.

The Talks at TEDxJECRC- All the 10 Speakers presented their talks in the auditorium, A Block of JECRC Foundation. The sequence of their talk was Ms Reena Puri, Mrs Ajaita Shah, Mr Paresh Gupta, Ms Nandita Venkatesan, Mr Bamezai in first half (10:AM to 1:00PM) and Mr Nitin Mirani, Mrs Anuja Kapur, Mrs Nina Nayak, Ms Ritu, Mrs Gulyani, in second half (3:00PM to 6:00PM). The lunch took place in A block, JECRC Foundation between (1:30PM to 2:30PM). Mr Ajit Singh, the Indian Ambassador to TED also visited the event along with a companion.

Breaking Barriers of Society in Rural India: Women Empowerment through Enterprise. Ms Ajaita Shah, the gentlewoman brought up under the influence of New York and Jaipur society tell us in her talk, how the society tries to dictate the choices that a girl child makes, while she is fighting to grow up. The Changing Modus Operand of Crime- Mrs. Anuja Kapoor, a criminal psychologist in her talk asks to rediscover the society by not letting the gender of kids make a difference in the way they are nurtured. She says crime has evolved in the society with time and the criminals are not born criminals but learned criminals.

When Ms Ritu giggles, she gives no indication of the ordeal she's gone through in the year 2012. One look at her face, though, tells the horror story. An acid attack last year changed Ritu's life overnight. She dropped out of school, left state-level volleyball practice, and has confined herself to her Rohtak home. Haryana, with its skewed sex ratio, isn't the best of places for a girl to grow up. Ritu, like any other girls in State, has also sensed the male supremacy and retrogressive mindset at every step. After joining Stop Acid Attacks, Ritu's life is slowly getting back on track.

Acid Attack-The Prevailing Devil in our Society- Ms. Ritu, an acid attack survivor narrates her story of surviving an acid attack for which her own cousin was responsible. After fighting for the life she also fought for justice. She also tells about the SHEROES organization that works for acid attack victims.

Mrs Nina Nayak, Child rights and Human Rights Activist

Mrs Nayak has dedicated her entire life to the promotion and protection of child rights. Having served as a consultant in UNICEF, as the Chairperson of Karnataka State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, as the Honorary Vice President of Indian Council for Child Welfare, as the Honorary Working President Karnataka State Council for Child Welfare and numerous other influential positions, she has gathered a highly valuable experience of 30 years in the field of child development and protection which was efficiently reproduced at TEDx Bangalore. An AAP candidate from Bangalore South constituency and a social worker who has been praised with the Sadguru Gnanananda National Award for social entrepreneurship and from Bolar Education Trust for Dedication to Social Work, she has been a driving force in the implementation of 'Juvenile Justice Act' and the 'Protection of Children Against Sexual Offenses Act'.

Socio-economic Crisis and Sheer Poverty - Ms. Nina Nayak puts light on the socio-economic crisis that people live in. She talks about the joy of helping others and the pleasure of giving. She uses some real-life examples to explain to us that there is a big difference in which poverty exist in literature and in reality.

Ms Nandita Venkatesan, Tuberculosis AWARENESS Advocate

A communication professional and a public speaker, Ms. Nandita who was awarded for her courage by Zee Network, Franklin Templeton Investment, Rotary Award and Your Story, after getting severely infected by Tuberculosis twice in her lifetime in a quick succession lost 24kg, and suffered from complete hearing loss. But none of these obstacles could hinder her work. Even after suffering all that, she never let them come in her path and today, she is a journalist at The Economic Times, a Bharat Natyam dancer, now a TB awareness advocate and the only Indian selected to attend the Washington based ACTION.org public health advocacy training in Paris.

From Sound to Silence - Lessons from my journey into hearing loss - Ms. Venkatesan narrates her story of fighting tuberculosis but falling prey to the side effects of its drug thereby becoming impaired of hearing. She tells us about her world of silence, her choice to not give up, learning to lip read and using dance for healing.

Mr Rameshwar Nath Kaul Bamezai, Professor, Human Genome

Mr Bamezai is a scientist, a researcher, a professor and a Padma Shree. He served as a faculty at IMS, BHU and now JNU. He was the DEAN of Life sciences and school of Computational and Integrative Sciences. With more than 37 years of experience in teaching and guiding, he has published 135 papers in Journals like CELL, JBC etc. Under his guidance, more than 40 students have done PhD and advanced researches related to Human Genetics were created in many universities. His field of research is focused on the nucleus of cell, where the information of the entire society resides.

A PATHWAY TO HEALTHY SOCIETIES - Mr. Bamezai, explained us through his talk, the innermost facts of our body; from the effect of fast economic development and change in lifestyle on our bodies to the functioning of tiny little cells. The gentleman used a very simple language to make the engineers, who had very little knowledge of biology, understand the biological complexities that constantly run in the background.
